Rowing Tas – EOI for Rowing Schools Tasmania Commission

Damian Messer noted that the structure for Rowing has changed. Rowing Tas will conduct regattas and will now be called School Regatta 1, 2 and 3 plus HOR, North West Schools and All Schools Regattas. If Rowing Schools wish to have a say in these regattas it is important that they are involved and perhaps nominate an EOI.

AGENDA ITEMS

1. Welcome & update on SATIS (D Messer)

Damian Messer welcomed all delegates and acknowledged the work that many were doing in different areas within their schools as a result of COVID-19.

Delegates were advised to look at sporting options for possibly Term 3. However, it was stressed that each school will have their own specific circumstances that will need to be followed according to the management. All Catholic schools will be under the directive of the CEO, other schools will take directives from their Board of Management. Hence, it is vital that all delegates discuss all issues and options with their Principals and have this information at hand for discussion at the next meeting.

Damian Messer advised that there was an AHISA meeting last week. Principals will have clear protocols for visitors coming on site to schools. This will affect school sport.

We will be driven by government laws as to when school sport can start.

Athletics has very little chance of going ahead with the current guidelines – this would include school carnivals as well.

Training of any team sports is difficult until the restrictions of numbers allowed to attend are lifted.

Decisions are driven nationally but each State is different with Tasmania taking a more cautious approach at this stage.

Michael Moschogianis noted SVC had signed up for the Great Aust Cross Country event which had been received well by students.

6. Incomplete Summer Rosters – Basketball & Tennis (R Jeffery)

Discussion ensued around how many rounds are needed to finish the rosters in the South and North.

Further discussion will be needed at the next meeting to determine if these summer rosters will be completed and then finals played or if there will be a focus on those sports that would normally be played in Term 3.

Delegates noted there will be a push from outside sport associations and clubs and State organisations and we will need to juggle a lot of things to work out the best outcomes.

Adrian Finch - Returning to sports in a rush without appropriate preparation could lead to injury.

Craig Boon – decisions will depend on the guidelines given for the numbers we are allowed to include and that will determine which sports we may choose to go with.

Damian Messer – sole focus for all Principals will be on Grade 11 & 12 academic studies. He stressed again for delegates to discuss with their Principals prior to the next meeting.

7. AOB

Jason Berry – questioned if the decision has been made for Athletics in 2020.

Damian Messer noted social distancing will most probably be in place for 12 – 18 months and the number attending an outdoor event is capped at 100 for Stage 3. Currently we are still in Stage 1. So we have to wait and take the advice that is given and make decisions based on that but at this stage 2020 Athletics and potentially 2021 Swimming may not take place.
