Electronic Timing

The use electronic timing allows for improved accuracy in timing and place allocation. Records with the notation 'E', have been set when timed electronically. The following guidelines are used to determine records when using electronic timing:

100m, 200m and sprint hurdles- add 0.24 seconds. i.e. 10.8 seconds (hand held) = 11.04 seconds (electronic). Therefore, 11.04 seconds or below, (electronic) would equal or break a record of 10.8 seconds (hand held). 400m and 4 x 100m relays-add 0.14 seconds
For distances of 800m and beyond hand held and electronic are considered to be equal.

Coaches and Non-Officials

A reminder to all attending today's carnival that only designated officials and competitors are allowed onto the arena. The arena is that part of the track inside ropes or lane 8 when not roped off.

Uniform

Competitors are reminded that they may not compete unless wearing their school sports uniform. Competitors not complying with this rule will be disqualified.

Points Allocation

Individual Events: First placed competitor gains the same number of points as the number of eligible schools competing in the carnival for that shield. The competitor who comes second is given one point less than first place and the points are awarded to the other competitors on the same basis.

Relay Events: Double the number of points for a corresponding track event for the age and gender group.

Trophies

Record breakers will be announced at the conclusion of the carnival. Students are asked to come forward to receive SATIS certificates of recognition.

Age group pennants will be presented for boys and girls, prior to the presentation of aggregate trophies.

S.A.T.I.S. Code of Ethics (Short Form)

The following is a description of behaviour and attitudes at sporting competitions consistent with the spirit of the S.A.T.I.S. Code of Ethics:

1. All conventions of courtesy associated with a sport are emphasised in the coaching and management of a team.
2. Schools show courtesy to visiting players and spectators. Visiting teams will be punctual and are welcomed by the host school.
3. Visitors respect the host school's premises and rules in relevant matters such as parking, tidiness and access to buildings, playing areas and change rooms.
4. Competitors wear the recognised uniform and use the accepted equipment for each sport. Correct school colours are worn.
5. Coaches and/or managers of teams introduce themselves to opposition coaches or managers prior to the commencement of any fixture.
6. All behaviour, including language, on and off the field, by players and supporters is of the highest standard. School and match officials are expected to take action should this not be the case.
7. Decisions by the umpire are accepted without dissent or comment by players, coaches and spectators.
8. Only those designated by schools as coaches or officials are permitted to coach during the game. They must do so within the regulations of the particular sport.
9. The use of noise or comment which intimidates is unacceptable.
10. Inclusivity: We provide a sporting environment that is free from discrimination based on language, sexual orientation, culture, ethnicity, religion, health or disability, family circumstances and origin.
